


Purple Tier - What's Changed?



County and State restrictions differ. Please follow the stricter of the two.

Open indoors at 20% capacity:

Personal care services

e.g. hair salons and barber shops; nail care; body art, tattoo, and piercing shops; esthetician, skin care, and cosmetology services; electrology, waxing, threading, and other hair removal services)



Open outdoors with modifications (closed indoors):

- Dining
- Wineries
- Bars, breweries, and distilleries serving food
- Gatherings of up to 3 households
 - See Mandatory Directive on Capacity Limitations
- Adult recreation activities
 - For activities that are no-contact
- Professional and collegiate sports
- Family entertainment centers
- Cardrooms
- Museums, zoos, and aquariums
- Youth Sports

What is still in effect?

- **Mandatory Directive on Travel**
 - Requires most people who travel into the county from more than 150 miles away to quarantine for 10 days upon their arrival
- **Mandatory Directive for Lodging Facilities**
 - Lodging facilities may not provide lodging services for non-essential purposes, such as tourism, recreational, or leisure purposes.



The key to fewer restrictions is following public health measures.

Counties can move to a less restrictive tier as COVID transmission goes down and testing goes up.

Stay diligent. Keep staying home, wearing masks, keeping distance, getting tested, and getting vaccinated when it's your turn.
